Toured storage facility to take inventory. Make decision on what to keep or give away.

Rebuilt retaining wall on upper parking lot. Placed concrete bumpers to keep cars from driving over wall. Back filled with rock and replaced stolen capstones. Thanks to Allen Dukes supervision.

Poured concrete pad for dumpster. Thanks to Allen Dukes supervision,

Purchased 20' used shipping container for storage. Painted with primer and finish coats. Placed in far southwest corner of lower lot.

Recruited Allen Dukes, Rick Mabry, Michael Griffin, Mr. Briggs and myself to remove all tables, chairs, coat racks and other items in Parish Hall and placed in storage container. Repaired little library.

Fogged and sprayed insecticide for a spider infestation in both Sanctuary, Sacristy, Offices, Parish Hall and Kitchen.

Patched hole in roof near opening for bell rope.
