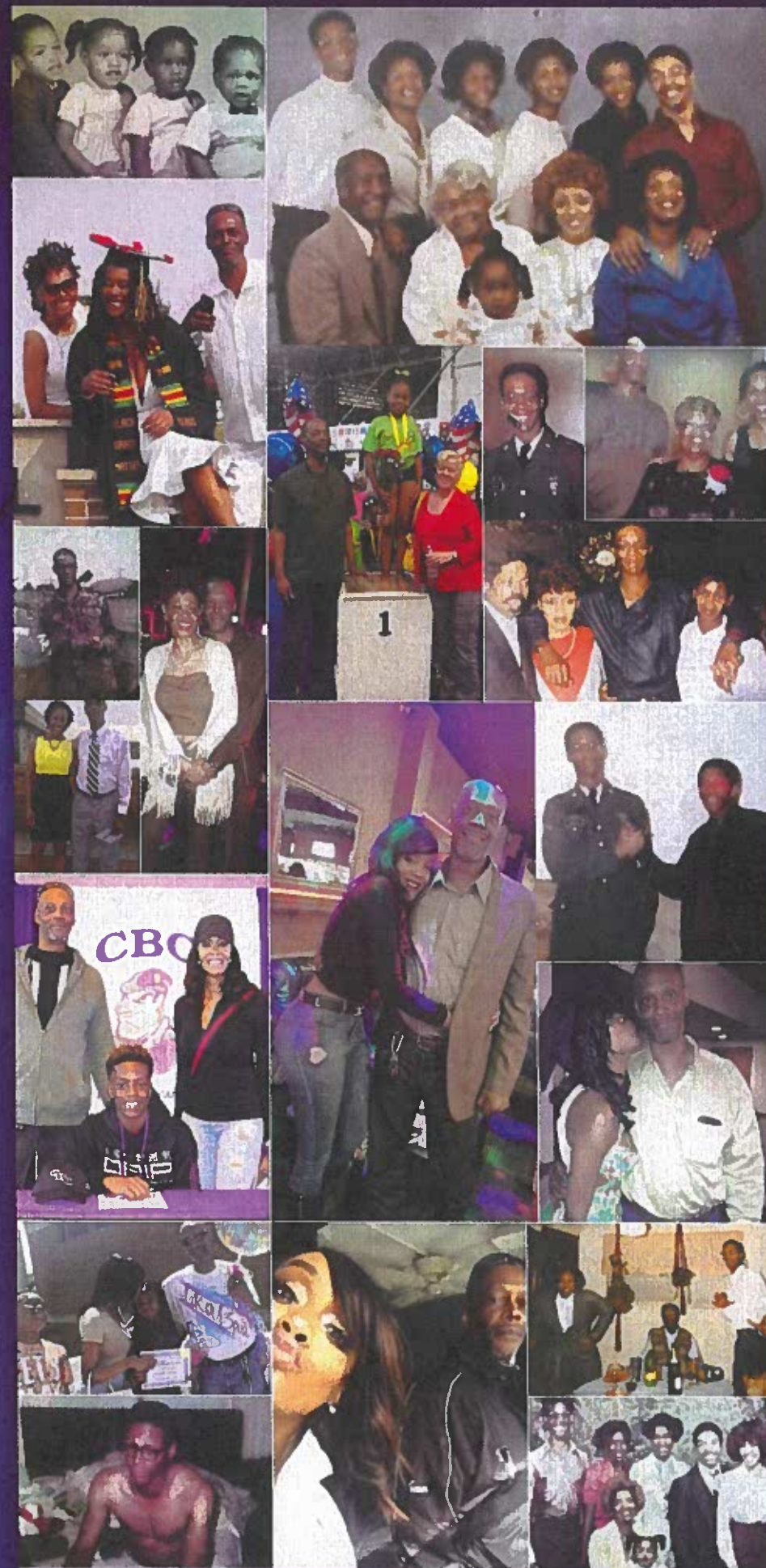
He was educated at Normandy High School with a degree from Valterott College in information Technology. He enlisted in the United States Army and was released from active duty in 1990.
